is running. While there have been some minor issues with the new management system, it is a notable improvement on the previous email-based system. The current volume, 51, is being loaded at the moment, thanks to the efforts of Chris Wong. It has 7 papers already published and a further 4 are in the copyediting stage with a combined page count around 104 pages.

This year we published a special volume to the memorial of Sir Vaughan Jones and with Guest Editors Marston Conder, Rod Downey, David Gauld and Gaven Martin. At the moment it has already 21 papers, with a total length of 726 pages. The very first paper is the famous paper ‘Planar algebras’ by Vaughan Jones which has been on arXiv at <https://arxiv.org/abs/math/9909027> since 1999, with the original aim to be published in the NZJM. Special thanks are due to David Gauld for taking care of the copyediting/publishing stage for this special volume.

The papers in the Journal now have a DOI-number. It is the aim to obtain a DOI-number also for all the old papers. Moreover, the Journal is now a member of the Free Journal Network (FJN) <https://freejournals.org> .
